

The Opportunity:

The <u>WiSys</u> Pre-Award Manager – Sponsored Programs plays a key role in delivering programming on preparing persuasive grant proposals to faculty, staff and students at the University of Wisconsin – System Campuses, specifically <u>UW-Oshkosh</u>, <u>UW-Parkside</u>, and <u>UW-Platteville</u>. This position is responsible for counseling faculty and staff on proposal preparation and recommending best practice policies and procedures to promote a culture of research.

Key responsibilities include:

- Recognize institutional barriers and expectations of faculty research and scholarship and then develop programs and incentives to stimulate grant seeking activity
- Provide education and counsel to research administrators on primarily pre-award research administration topics
- Discuss with research administrators approaches to effectively engaging faculty and staff in individual and collaborative grant seeking and manage the pre-award process
- Work collaboratively with WiSys staff and assist the WiSys President as requested

Qualifications:

We are seeking candidates with the proven ability to communicate and build rapport with university faculty, staff and students; knowledge of fundamental concepts, practices and procedures of research administration and the pre-award process; competency in proposal development and budget preparation and review; and strong presentation, training and facilitation skills. Experience in grants or sponsored program administration or relevant experience in a higher education setting is required. A bachelor's degree in a scientific or related field required, while an advanced degree is preferred. Travel is required.
