UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION SUPPORT PROGRAM (UASP) RESEARCH MANAGEMENT FELLOWSHIPS



THE UASP FELLOWSHIP, administered by IREX since 2002, develops higher education management capacity in universities in Africa and Euraisa. The model brings cohorts of university administrators and faculty to the United States for training and a four-week work placement to meet counterparts at a partnering U.S. host institution. Effective host institution placements are the linchpin of successful UASP fellowships—they offer in-depth opportunities for fellows to observe and compare U.S. institutional administrative systems and share best practices. Fellows return home equipped with progressive management techniques, U.S. relationships, and a practical plan to implement institutional reform. Most recently the fellowship has specifically focused on developing research management capacity.
